Please compose an essay to each of the two questions below. Each essay should follow a 5-paragraph essay format, with an introductory paragraph including a clear thesis and the body paragraphs detailing a coherent analysis of your topic.

I. Individualism 50%

Individualism is key to the making of the country of America and its citizens. The idea of the self-made person is bound up with aspirations of the American dream, the ideal of democracy and equal opportunity for all. Choose a literary work to discuss this concept. Be sure to specify the context in which you situate the idea. You may consider aspects such as the following: 1) What values, problems, expectations or disillusionment is communicated in the work's interpretation of individualism? 2) How is individualism represented—through a hero, an ordinary person, or a little boy/girl? What is the oppositional forces in society or nature are being portrayed? 3) In what aspects do the characters learn or become disillusioned in constructing oneself as a being who is capable of realizing one's own dreams?

II. Community 50%

Many individuals compose a community or society. In American literature, how is the idea of community represented and what is the relationship between individuals and the larger environment they inhabit? Choose one work to discuss the idea of community in American literature. You may want to consider the following: 1) Is a community conceived differently from a society? In what ways are they different? 2) How is the idea of community related to "home," "journey," "cultural traditional," "ethics," "legal system," "ecology," etc. 3) In what ways do the characters deal with their vision of community? For instance, do they attempt to launch social or legal "change," or do they demarcate a clear boundary between the two? How so, and why?
