- B. The constitution of 1787 was the product of seven centuries of development in England and America. Magna Charta (1215) is as much the heritage of Americans as of Englishmen. So is the common law which limited the authority of the king's ministers as well as governed the king's subjects. The rights and privileges of Parliament were claimed by colonial legislatures against royal governors.
