  of life" in <u>Poetics</u>. Comment on this statement with the example of <u>Medea</u>.
- 4. What is the subject of <u>Metamorphoses</u>? And how does Ovid treat this subject in his long epic? Give examples to support your points.
- From what can the reader see the narrator's (Encolpius) naivety during his dinner with Trimalchio? Give two examples.
- 6. In the plot development of <u>Agamemnon</u>, how does Aeschylus suggest the forthcoming tragedy, namely the regicide, before the murderous action of Clytaemnestra?
- II. Paraphrase the following passages (35 %): (to paraphrase a passage is to express the meaning of the passage in other words so as to bring out the sense.)
- 1. "Ah, wretched man, in dreadful wise beguiled, bewrayed, thy soul is sore distressed. I pity thee, alas! alas! What soul, what loins, what liver could stand this strain? How firm and unyielding he stands, with naught to aid him of a morning."
- 2. "But it breaks my spirit; underneath my breast all the heart is shaken. Let me only glance where you are, the voice dies, I can say nothing, but my lips are stricken to silence, underneath my skin the tenuous flame suffuses; nothing shows in front of my eyes, my ears are muted in thunder".
- 3. "Remember, I pray thee, who ever perished, being innocent? or where were the righteous cut off? Even as I have seen, they that plow iniquity, and sow wickedness, reap the same. By the blast of God they perish, and by the breath of his nostrils are they consumed".
