Part I: English Literature (60%)

Below are four questions on the main course of development and the leading characteristics throughout the history of English literature. Please choose *THREE* of them and write cogent essays in response.

- Write an essay on medieval humor with the focus on The Miller's Tale and The Second Shepherds' Play. Compare the two and explain in what way the humor of The Second Shepherds' Play may be said to differ in its function within the play as a whole from the humor of The Miller's Tale.
- 2. As the film Shakespeare in Love testifies, both Elizabethan subjects and their discourses are very much shaped by the Queen. Please select a work of the English Renaissance and examine the politics of Elizabethan representation or the problematic centrality of the female monarch as author, audience, and subject.
- 3. Please identify the source (author and work) and briefly indicate the significance of the following quotations:
 - a. This flea is you and L and this / Our marriage bed, and marriage temple is.
 - b. A little learning is a dangerous thing.
 - c. One equal temper of heroic hearts, / Made weak by time and fate, but strong in will / To strive, to seek, to find, and not to yield.
 - d. They, hand in hand, with wandering steps and slow / Through Eden took their solitary way.
 - e. Indeed, if woman had no existence save in the fiction written by men, one would imagine her a person of the utmost importance; very various; heroic and mean; splendid and sordid; infinitely beautiful and hideous in the extreme; as great as a man, some think even greater. But this is woman in fiction.
- Please discuss the sense of the self in Dorothy Wordsworth's The Grasmere
 Journals and Doris Lessing's To Room Nineteen. (Or, as an alternative pair, the
 conception of the self in William Wordsworth's The Prelude and Joseph Conrad's
 Heart of Darkness.)
